Billing Guidelines Wound Care (CPT Codes 97597, 97598 and 11042-11047) 1. Active wound care procedures are performed to remove devitalized and/or necrotic tissue to promote healing. Debridement is the removal of foreign material and/or devitalized or contaminated tissue from or adjacent to a traumatic or infected wound until surrounding healthy tissue is exposed.

The following Medicare coverage guidance applies to surgical dressing claims: Surgical dressings are covered when a qualifying wound is present. A qualifying wound is defined as either of the following: • A wound caused by, or treated by, a surgical procedure • A wound that requires debridement, regardless of the debridement technique

Outpatient Wound Care Coverage Under Medicare If you receive wound care in an outpatient setting, such as at your doctor's office, coverage would fall under Part B. Part B also covers Durable Medical Equipment. This includes any supplies that are medically necessary to treat your wound. Just like Part A, Part B also comes with a deductible.

Proper wound care coding requires careful reading of all Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) code descriptors and related CPT Manual instructions. Wound care has previously been brought to the attention of CMS as a service potentially necessitating a higher standard of supervision, and as such is a likely candidate for additional rulemaking. 15 Any change to the supervision requirements for wound care, or any other service, is done on a case-by-case basis.

Does Medicare Pay for Wound Care and Supplies?

Through your Medicare Part B benefits, Medicare covers 80 percent of Medicare approved costs for the services provided by your health care provider for wound care. You are responsible for the remaining 20 percent. You also pay a fixed copayment if the wound care services are provided in a hospital on an outpatient basis. You are also responsible for the Part B deductible which is \$185.00 (as of 2019). With Medicare Part B coverage, you do not have to pay anything for the materials and ...

Daily Skilled Nursing If in an exceptional circumstance (e.g., when progress is noted in wound healing and daily visits need to continue for a specific amount of time), daily skilled nursing (SN) care is needed beyond 21 days, then a finite and predictable endpoint to the daily skilled nursing care is needed.

CMS felt this protected the patient from having unsupervised wound care and hyperbaric treatments because the physician must provide a level of service that would clearly be greater than general supervision. Just being available by phone does not meet the definition of that CPT code.

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
